

Moulsecomb Forest Garden and Woodland Project

WARREN Carter is happiest seeing children out of the classroom.

The head of Moulsecomb Forest Garden and Woodland Project has transformed a patch of derelict land in East Brighton into a flourishing wildlife of diversity and sustainability since it formed in 1994.

The once barren strip has been transformed into a World Garden, a heritage orchard, a fairy tale forest, organic vegetable gardens, a large treehouse, an outdoor clay oven, turf sofa, traditional bee hive and bee garden.

The project also runs the environment club at Moulsecomb Primary School.

About 25 children visit the project every week to use skills they might never have thought they possessed.

Mr Carter's nominee Kati-Jane Offord, from Hodshrove Road, Brighton, said: "Warren has not only transformed Moulsecomb Primary School's grounds and got children involved but he also runs Moulsecomb Wildlife Project.

"He works alongside teenagers, teaching them life skills and focuses on their positives rather than their negatives."
